# All Saints' and All Souls' Day

This coming Saturday, November 1st is All Saints' Day, and Sunday, November 2nd is All Souls' Day. The Church traditionally has feast days for numerous saints throughout the year. On November 1st, we have the opportunity to celebrate all the saints at one time in an annual solemnity. This feast day should inspire tremendous hope. All of the saints' lives on earth are very much like our own. They were faithful to Christ's teaching, have gone before us to the heavenly home, and are calling us to follow.

s Corner

Pope Boniface IV started the first All Saints' Day on May 13<sup>th</sup>, 609 AD, when he consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the martyrs. Boniface also established All Souls' Day following All Saints'. Pope Gregory III moved the day to November 1<sup>st</sup> in the mid-eight century.

All Souls' Day is also recognized as *The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead.* It is a holiday of prayer and memorial for the souls of those who have passed. Additionally, there are many ancient customs associated with the commemoration of the dead: visits to the cemetery with the cleaning and tidying up of graves, the setting up of commemorative altars, a meal shared there by the grave with special dishes served on the day, and so on. The customs surrounding All Souls' Day represent the various cultural influences of the worldwide Catholic Church. For example, in Western Europe and America, we typically visit and take flowers to the graves of our deceased relatives. Eastern Europeans typically place lit candles on the graves instead of flowers. Mexico celebrates the Day of the Dead. In the Philippines, graves can be painted and repaired by family members.

For this year's All Saints' Day, may God grant you peace as you pray for the intercession of the saints in our lives. On All Souls' Day, we must remember to show our love for the departed by interceding for them and hastening their journey from purification to the blessedness of heaven, from whence they will pray for us gratefully.
