#### Deacon's Corner

#### The O Antiphons

By now, you have probably heard a lot of Christmas music both secular and sacred. However, there is one song that truly belongs to Advent, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." This song is from the 12<sup>th</sup> century, based on Gregorian chant and has its verses taken from the Church's O Antiphons. The O Antiphons, also known as the Greater Antiphons, are from the daily pray of the Church, known as the Liturgy of the Hours or Divine Office. They are part of evening prayer for Dec. 17<sup>th</sup> – Dec. 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The seven O Antiphons are the names given in the Book of Isaiah for the Messiah. Many families add the O Antiphons to their prayers during Advent. Here are the antiphon prayers from the Liturgy of the Hours:

- Dec. 17: "**O Wisdom**, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. Come and show your people the way to salvation." (O Sapientia)
- Dec. 18: "O sacred Lord of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai mountain: come, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free." (O Adonai)
- Dec. 19: "O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid." (O Radix Jesse)
- Dec. 20: "O **Key of David**, O royal Power of Israel controlling at your will the gate of heaven: come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom." (O Clavis David)
- Dec. 21: "O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come, shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death." (O Oriens)
- Dec. 22: "O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, come, and save the creature you fashioned from thedust." (O Rex Gentium)
- Dec. 23: "**O Emmanuel**, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God." (O Emmanuel)

As we approach the end of Advent, let the prayers for the O Antiphons continue to fill you with the joy and majesty of the season.


