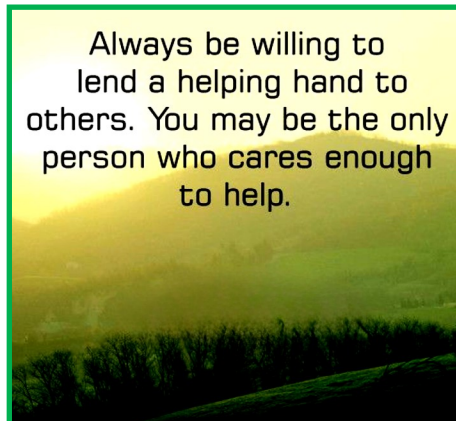
I look forward to being home with you the weekend of June 21.

The Most Holy Body and Blood Of Christ - Feast Of Corpus Christi

~ Deacon's Corner ~

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



This Sunday, we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, Latin for “Body of Christ.” The feast originated in France in the 13th century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. This feast calls us to celebrate the Body of Christ present in the Holy Eucharist and the Church.

I always enjoy the profound and inspired words of the Saints. So, I thought it would be interesting to look at what some of the Saints thought and wrote about the Eucharist. Here are a few examples from a recent Catholic New Agency (CNA) article and Big C Catholic website.

St. Thomas Aquinas: “The Eucharist is the sacrament of love: it signifies love, it produces love. The Eucharist is the consummation of the whole spiritual life.”

St. Francis de Sales: “When the bee has gathered the dew of heaven and the earth’s sweetest nectar from the flowers, it turns it into honey, then hastens to its hive. In the same way, the priest, having taken from the altar the Son of God (who is as the dew from heaven, and true son of Mary, flower of our humanity), gives him to you as delicious food.”

St. John Chrysostom: “It is not the man who is responsible for the offerings as they become Christ’s Body and Blood; it is Christ Himself who was crucified for us. The standing figure belongs to the priest who speaks these words. The power and the grace belong to God. ‘This is My Body,’ he says. And these words transform the offerings.”

St. Francis of Assisi “O sublime humility! O humble sublimity! That the Lord of the whole universe, God and the Son of God, should humble himself like this and hide under the form of a little bread, for our salvation.”

St. John Vianney: Believed that *“If we truly understood the Eucharist, we would die of love rather than of fear.”*

St. Maximilian Kolbe: “If angels could be jealous of men, they would be so for one reason: Holy Communion.”

St. Pio of Pietrelcina: “A thousand years of enjoying human glory is not worth even an hour spent sweetly communing with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.”

St. Alphonsus Ligouri: “My Jesus! What a lovable contrivance this holy Sacrament was - that You would hide under the appearance of bread to make Yourself loved and to be available for a visit by anyone who desires You!”

St. Pius X: “The devotion to the Eucharist is the most noble because it has God as its object; it is the most profitable for salvation, because It gives us the Author of Grace; it is the sweetest, because the Lord is Sweetness Itself.”

St. Teresa of Calcutta: “Put your sins in the chalice for the precious blood to wash away. One drop is capable of washing away the sins of the world. “The Eucharist is connected with the Passion. If Jesus had not established the Eucharist we would have forgotten the crucifixion. It would have faded into the past and we would have forgotten that Jesus loved us. There is a saying that to be far away from the eyes is to be far away from the heart. To make sure that we do not forget, Jesus gave us the Eucharist as a memorial of his love.

Here is a prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, in the Most Holy Eucharist, you give yourself to us completely. May we receive your Body and Blood with faith and humility, and carry your peace into the world with compassion. Strengthen our unity, and let your sacrifice continually nourish our souls.
