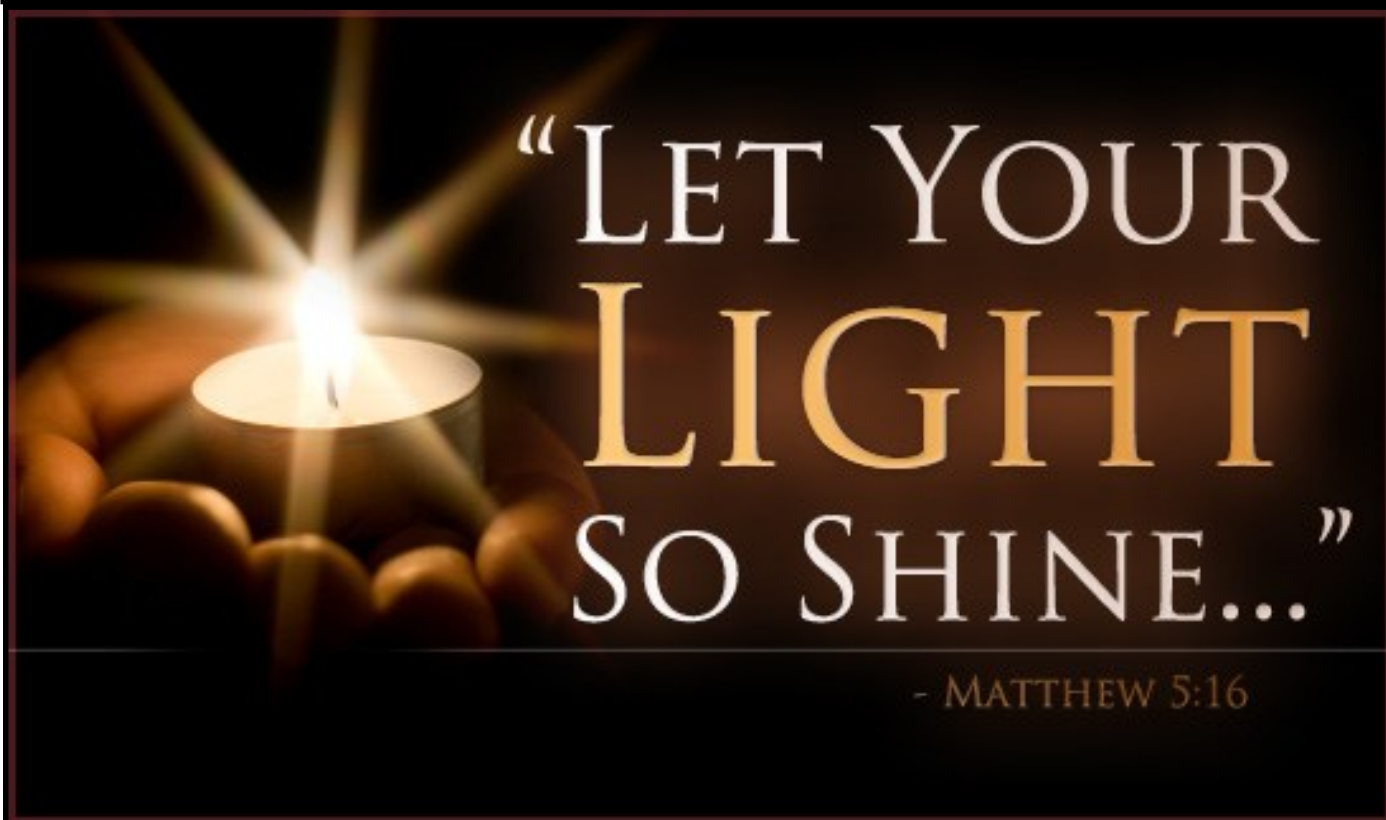

~ Deacon's Corner ~

Our Lady of Lourdes

The Church celebrates the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes on February 11th. On February 11, 1858, 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous was collecting firewood with her sister and a friend near a grotto when she saw a vision of a lovely lady. This was the first of 18 visits, many of which had 20,000 people present. When Bernadette asked the Lady's identity, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Just four years earlier, on December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX had proclaimed the dogma that Mary was conceived immaculately without original sin. The Blessed Virgin, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart. Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also instructed Bernadette to tell the priests that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held.

Four years after Our Lady of Lourdes appeared to Bernadette, the local bishop ruled that the apparitions were authentic. St. Bernadette eventually entered the Sisters of Charity, where she continued to suffer physically, uniting her suffering to Christ. She died in the Sainte Croix (Holy Cross) Infirmary of the Convent of Saint-Gildard at 35 on April 16, 1879, while praying the holy rosary.

Thus, why do over 2 million people each year make their way through the mountainous country of southern France to Lourdes? They come seeking cures, hoping to find answers, believing, and praying. At Lourdes, people recall Mary being dressed in white, with a blue sash, yellow roses at her feet, and a Rosary on her arm. Lourdes is one of the most famous apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the entire world.

Holy Mother Mary, pray for us.

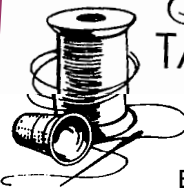

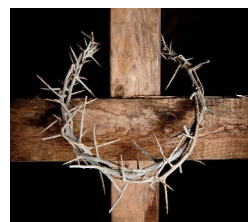
