Our Lady of Sorrows

This upcoming week and next has a sequence of celebrations and feast days on the Church's Calendar.



- •Friday, Sept. 12th Most Holy Name of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- •Saturday, Sept. 13th Saint John Chrysostom
- •Sunday, Sept. 14th Exaltation of the Holy Cross
- •Monday, Sept. 15th Our Lady of Sorrows

This week I would like to spend some time discussing Our Lady of Sorrows. The Catholic Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15th, just one day after the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This is to confirm the close connection between Jesus' Passion and Mary's Sorrows. Celebration of this feast day goes back to the 15th century. The important references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. These two scripture passages bring together prediction and fulfillment.

Here is a list of the Seven Sorrows of Mary and a scripture reference for each one:

- The Prophecy of Simeon "And you yourself a sword will pierce." (Lk. 2:35)
- The Flight into Egypt "The angel of Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt." (Mt. 2:13)
- Search for the Child in Jerusalem "After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. When his parents saw him they were astonished, and his mother said to him, 'Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." (Lk. 2:46, 48)
- Mary Meets Jesus on His Way to the Cross "A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him." (Lk. 23:27)
- Standing at the Foot of the Cross "When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there who he loved, he said to his mother, 'Woman behold, your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his home." (Jn. 19:26-27)
- The Crucifixion and Descent from the Cross "After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. So he came and took his body." (Jn. 19:38)
- Assisting at the Burial of Christ "The women who had come from Galilee with him followed behind and when they had seen the tomb and the way in which his body was laid in it, they returned and prepared spices and perfumed oils." (Lk. 23:55-56)

Remembering and meditating on these seven sorrows, we can turn to Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, for consolation in our suffering.

Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, pray for us.
